Ecotoxicology for Hazard Communication

Sunday, March 15, 2015 Hilton San Francisco Financial District – San Francisco, California

Course Description

This course is designed to provide an introduction to the principles of ecotoxicology as they pertain to hazard communication. Emphasis will be placed on an understanding of how ecological effects of chemicals' are determined, the transport and fate of chemicals within the ecosystem, and the processes hazard communication and risk assessment.

The goal of this course is to provide an in-depth examination of how chemicals interact with the ecosystem to produce adverse ecological effects. Emphasis is placed on the understanding and tools necessary to identify chemicals with the potential to cause adverse ecological effects that are relevant to hazard communication. This course was recently updated for GHS and REACH.

This is considered to be a basic course and there are no prerequisites. However, it is recommended that participants have either taken the SCHC course, Toxicology for Hazard Communication, or that they be comfortable with the basic principles of toxicology.

Intended Audience

Hazard communication professionals looking to broaden their understanding of ecotoxicology and to sharpen their hazard determination and risk assessment skills.
