Presentation abstract

A major revision to the EU CLP Regulation was agreed earlier this year which will have a significant impact on companies placing products on the EU market. The changes include measures to speed up the harmonized classification process, especially for substances identified as meeting the new hazard classes; new provisions to take account of technological and societal changes, such as digital labelling and requirements for refillerries; and major changes to the requirements for label design and layout, including new minimum font sizes, rules on label text colour and spacing, and timescales for updating labels when new information becomes available. In addition to this, the EU is also proceeding with its regular programme of updates to the list of harmonized classifications.
