

OSHA - State Plan Option

- Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA)
 - Williams Steiger Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970
 - Under Section 18 of the Occupational Safety and Health Act
 - »(b) <u>Any state</u> can assume responsibility for development and enforcement of occupational safety and health standards... (abridged)



State Plan Standards Adoption

State Plan Adoption of OSHA Standards

Enforcement

Policy/procedures as, or more, effective than OSHA

Options

Adopt identical or different enforcement policies than OSHA

Submit

Notice of intent within 60 days

Adoption


• Either identical or different within 6 months

Adopts OSHA rules verbatim (NCDOL default)

NCDOL Rules

State Specific Rules

- 1: Promulgate new rules
- 2: Amend adopted Fed rules

New HazCom Standard Update

Why the HCS Update?

The Hazard Communications Standard (HCS) requires periodic revision to maintain consistency with the Globally Harmonized System (HGS) and incorporate the progression of scientific principles and best approaches for classification and communication of workplace hazards related to hazardous chemical exposure.

Federal Register / Vol. 89, No. 98 / Monday, May 20, 2024 / Rules and Regulations



Summary of Changes

- (c) Definitions
 - bulk shipment, combustible dust, gas, liquid, solid, PLHPC
- (d) Hazard Classification
 - Clarifies hazards requiring classification
- (f) Labels
 - US contact, small container labelling, immediate outer package
- (i) Trade Secrets
 - SDS to list trade secret ingredient concentration in one of the prescribed ranges

Key Dates

- May 20, 2024
 - Final rule published in federal registry
- July 19, 20244
 - Effective at the Federal level
- September 19, 2024
 - NC public hearing
- January 2025
 - NC effective date (TBD)

 - Enforcement policy/procedures are subject to change as required
