**Course Description and Objectives**

The goal of this course is to develop an understanding of U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) consumer product labeling requirements, with a primary focus on the Federal Hazardous Substances Act (FHSA). The course examines the regulatory framework and risk-based principles that govern FHSA-compliant consumer labels, including how hazard determination and risk assessment drive required label elements. It also addresses the practical coexistence of FHSA consumer labels with OSHA Hazard Communication Standard (HazCom 2012) workplace labels. Through discussion and selected examples, participants enhance their ability to interpret FHSA requirements and assess consumer labeling compliance in real-world situations.

This is an advanced course intended for professionals who already have a foundational understanding of toxicology and hazard communication. While there are no formal prerequisites, participants are expected to have a working knowledge of Safety Data Sheets and product labels and to be familiar with basic concepts of toxicology, hazard determination, and risk assessment, either through completion of the SCHC courses *Toxicology for Hazard Communication* and *Health Hazard Determination and Risk Assessment* or equivalent experience.

**Intended Audience**

This course is intended for hazard communication and product stewardship professionals who have responsibility for reviewing, interpreting, or developing consumer product labels regulated under the Federal Hazardous Substances Act (FHSA). It is particularly relevant for product stewards, regulatory and compliance specialists, EHS professionals, and toxicology-adjacent roles who support consumer product compliance and labeling decisions. The course is also appropriate for professionals who work at the interface of OSHA Hazard Communication and CPSC requirements and who seek a deeper understanding of how FHSA consumer labeling requirements are applied in practice.

- Risk-based labeling principles and hazard determination under FHSA
- Role of voluntary standards in consumer product labeling
