Presentation Title: Data available under REACH and Global Impact of those Data

## Presentation abstract:

Entities registering substances under REACH had to collect all existing available information on the intrinsic properties of a substance as well as on its manufacture, uses, and exposure. There could also be a need to generate data to fulfil endpoints not addressed with existing data. The availability of these data, compiled into dossiers, has applications and implications not only under REACH but also in other jurisdictions for other purposes. There also are entities other than those subject to REACH, including other companies and governmental agencies that may be seeking the data generated and compiled under REACH for REACH and/or non-REACH purposes.

Companies that are data owners or have been granted data citation rights must understand the ways in which data can be shared and disseminated, the potential legal and regulatory liabilities they face when data are disseminated beyond REACH, and any means by which such liabilities can be limited.
