EPA: List of Disinfectants for Emergency Pathogens, Including Monkeypox

EPA Extends Comment Period Regarding Asbestos Ban

EPA: List of Disinfectants for Emergency Pathogens, Including Monkeypox

At the end of May, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) was prompted to release its <u>emerging vital pathogen</u> (EVP) <u>guidance</u> in response to recent cases of monkeypox in the United States. EPA expects products on the <u>List of Disinfectants for EVP</u> to kill monkeypox when used according to the label directions.

When rare or novel viruses cause outbreaks of disease, there may be few if any disinfectants that have been tested and registered for use against that specific pathogen. To prepare for situations like these, the EPA created the EVP guidance, which allows disinfectant manufacturers to submit data to the EPA demonstrating a product's efficacy against difficult-to-inactivate viruses. Proper disinfectants play an important role in preventing the spread of viruses, such as an orthopoxvirus that causes monkeypox. Learn more about monkeypox.

EPA Extends Comment Period Regarding Asbestos Ban

In April 2022, the EPA released a proposed rule that would ban chrysotile asbestos, the only known form of asbestos that is currently imported into the United States. Chrysotile asbestos is found in products like asbestos diaphragms used by the chlor-alkali industry, sheet gaskets.



brake blocks, aftermarket automotive brakes/linings, other vehicle friction products and other gaskets imported into the United States. The proposed rule also discussed disposal and recordkeeping requirements.

Originally, the comment period was set to close on June 13, 2022, but the agency has extended the comment period until July 13, 2022. Safe Work Australia: Amendments to the model WHS laws

CA Proposition 65 Adopts NSRL

California's Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) has <u>adopted a</u> No Significant Risk Level (NSRL) of 3.7 micrograms per day for exposures to 1,3-dichloropropene by



the oral and inhalation routes (adopted in Title 27, Cal. Code of Regs., Section 25705(b)). NSRLs provide guidance for determining when a warning is required for exposures to chemicals listed as causing cancer. For more information on NSRLs, visit the OEHHA NSRLs page.

Safe Work Australia: Amendments to the model WHS laws

Safe Work Australia has <u>published amendments to the model</u> Work Health and Safety (WHS) laws on the Safe Work Australia website. Recommendations have been finalized with amendments being applied to both the <u>model WHS Act</u> and <u>model WHS Regulations</u>. Some important amendments include dealing with psychological risks, work group provisions, health and safety representative training, investigation and inspector access, data and recordkeeping regulations, and more.

Immediate risk management suggested for 300 harmful chemicals - ECHA has issued a fourth report under its Integrated Regulatory Strategy. In 2021, assessments were finalized for more than 1,900 substances, mostly grouped based on their structural similarity. This has 30% more than in 2020. Around 300 of these substances require risk management measures, while 800 do not currently require further action. For an overview and links to relevant items, visit this webpage.

Finding the most effective ways to manage chemical risks

Some chemicals are harmful, but managing their risks is much more than just banning them. It is about figuring out the most suitable ways to control their use to make sure they do not damage the environment or cause us harm.

Glyphosate: no change proposed to hazard classification - ECHA's Committee for Risk Assessment (RAC) <u>agrees</u> to keep glyphosate's current classification as causing serious eye damage and being toxic to aquatic life. Based on a wide-ranging review of scientific evidence, the committee again concludes that classifying glyphosate as a carcinogen is not justified.

Call for Evidence on Nitrosamines - ECHA has launched a call for evidence on the following **nitrosamines**:

- N-nitrosodiethylamine (diethylnitrosoamine) (EC 200-226-1, CAS 55-18-5);
- N-nitrosodimethylamine (dimethylnitrosoamine) (EC 200-549 -8, CAS 62-75-9);
- N-nitroso di-n-propylamine (EC 210-698-0, CAS 621-64-7);
 and
- N-nitrosodiethanoamine (2,2'-(Nitrosoimino)bisethanol) (EC 214-237-4; CAS 1116-54-7).

The aim is to gather new scientific information on uses, exposure, health effects, toxicology, epidemiology and modes of action of these substances. The deadline for comments is **September 6**, **2022**.

One Hazardous Chemical Added to the Candidate List - As of June 10, 2022, the Candidate List of Substances of Very High Concern now contains 224 entries. The <u>latest addition includes N (hydroxymethyl)acrylamide</u>. The chemical may cause cancer or genetic defects, and is mostly used in polymers and when manufacturing other chemicals, textiles, leather or fur.

SCIP Updates - In June, ECHA <u>updated</u> the SCIP Candidate List package. They also <u>added the role "Submission Portal Manager Restricted"</u> so that persons assigned this role can only see submissions they have made in the portal. This increases the confidentiality for SCIP and poison centre notifiers.
